


## Excavation from late antiquity at Son Peretó

- On this visit you'll discover one of the first Christian churches on Mallorca, its cemetery, and the rooms and workshops near it.
- Timeline of the site: fifth to eighth centuries CE.
- The church or basilica could hold 400 people.
- The basilica floor was made of colour mosaics that can now be seen in Manacor History Museum.
- The baptistery is where new Christians were usually baptised.

## The prehistoric settlement at s'Hospitalet Vell

- During the visit you will take a tour through the prehistory of Mallorca from the time of the oldest monuments, the navetas, to the Roman conquest.

### • Timeline of the site:

Age of navetas or the bronze age: 1700–1200/1100 BCE.

Talayotic period: 1200/1100 BCE up to the first century BCE.

- Navetas are elongated horseshoe-shaped houses. Inside there is a fire and mud or stone benches.
- The rectangular enclosure is a space with two rooms arranged around a central courtyard.
- A talayot is the most monumental building in any Talayotic settlement, and the most effort was put into building it. We know that talayots were neither houses nor burial places. They were probably used for storage, lookouts or meeting rooms.
